## **NRF Floor Targets, Other Deprivation Floor Targets and Local Neighbourhood Renewal Strategy/Community Strategy Targets.**

The Government has set a goal of reducing deprivation by targeting resources to achieve the following objectives. The floor target objectives are actions that need to happen to bring the standards in the most disadvantaged areas to the national average. The Neighbourhood Renewal Fund is about improving services in the most disadvantaged areas. The LSP has signed up to a series of PUBLIC SERVICE AGREEMENT TARGETS, which NRF funding has been provided to improve the way services are delivered in the most deprived areas. Eg the floor target for education requires that the schools with low GCSE attainment are supported to bring their GCSE attainment to the District average. As an LSP there are also other deprivation related targets (National) and local targets as set out in the Community Strategy / Local Neighbourhood Renewal Strategy.

The following tables combine a series of targets which initiatives supported under NRF funding are tackling and also combines all the targets that the LSP are considering.

### ***Column One - The NRF Floor Target and relevant PSAs***

Floor target is a generic term that was used to describe targets that set a minimum standard for disadvantaged groups or area, or a narrowing of the gap between them and the rest of the country. The NRF Floor Targets are taken from NRF documentation and have been updated.

### ***Column 2 – Other Deprivation Related Floor Targets***

These targets may not be self evidently be about narrowing the gap between the most deprived areas and the rest, but are likely to have a disproportionate impact on the most deprived areas and are important for neighbourhood renewal.

### ***Column 3 – Local Neighbourhood Renewal Strategy / Community Strategy Targets***

These are the Local Neighbourhood Renewal Strategy/Community Strategy targets and are taken from the Bolsover Local Neighbourhood Renewal Strategy and Community Strategy, these targets are related to the priorities of the LSP.

The targets are split by theme and where there are linkages between targets this has been recognised. The themes are
